    - 2. In your opinion, why is the reasoning sound? \*
    - 3. In your opinion, what are the reasoning fallacies? \*
    - 4. Type three quotes that exemplify this philosophy.
  - C. Provide a bibliography of your sources.
- \* #2 & #3 may be supported by other philosophers. Whatever your opinion is, you should support it with examples, facts, authoritative opinion or analogies.
